JOINT WINNERS OF THE IDF SCHOLARSHIP ANNOUNCED

win IDF Scholarship**



The IDF Scholarship, jointly sponsored by Dairy UK and the Milk Development Council, was established in 2002. The main aim of the Scholarship is to give a young person employed in the dairy industry the opportunity to attend the annual IDF Summit and bring back good ideas or best practice from elsewhere in the global dairy industry for implementation in the UK.

As the standard of entries this year was so high, the judges decided that there should be two winners and these are **Adam Ball**, a dairy farmer from Staffordshire, and **Susanna Woodings**, a sales executive for Lactalis.



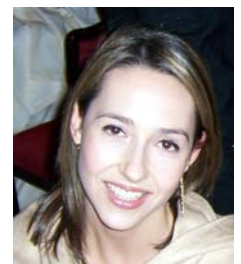
Adam Ball farms 364 acres in partnership with his parents in Alton and is in the process of expanding the enterprise. He says “Attending the Congress is a fantastic opportunity for me to look beyond the farm gate.

“As a dairy farmer you can become so bogged down in the day-to-day production of milk that you forget to look at the global issues that face all of us in the industry.

“I hope on my return to give farming colleagues the confidence to innovate and change.”

Susanna Woodings, who studied the import cheese market as part of an MSc, says: “I am absolutely thrilled to have been chosen to represent the UK dairy industry at such a prestigious event.

I am very much looking forward to meeting all the delegates from around the globe and being able to present my findings on international best practices back in the UK.”



The Scholarship entitles the winners to have their travel, accommodation and Congress fees paid and allows them to go on one of the Technical Trips that are being held as part of the Summit.

As winners, their duties are to write a 2,000 word article for inclusion in the Milk Industry Journal on their impressions of the Summit and, in particular, the good ideas they gathered. They will also give a presentation at the Dairy UK dinner and attend a report-back session with MDC members.

11 April 2007 – Cork, IRELAND



This symposium is a one day event highlighting the latest research, innovation, standards & developments relating to milking equipment. Papers on the latest advances in milking technology will be presented and the provisions in the new ISO standards for milking installations with particular focus on test procedures and installation standards will also be discussed.

The main objective is to improve the standard of testing and reporting on milking machine performance and introducing new and innovative milking time test procedures. The event will improve the awareness of effects of new milking technologies on milking performance, milk quality and labour demand.
